Victorian Christmas The children will learn about popular toys through the 20th century and the early 21st century. Throughout the unit, the children will develop a range of historical skills such as: asking and answering questions, identifying and interpreting different sources and recognising change and exploring how this influences them today. A range of learning activities are used in this unit which include: drawing discussions, role play and games as well as writing tasks.

Science - Seasonal Changes

The children will learn about the four seasons. Children will learn what the word weather means and find out how different types of weather can be measured. They will observe changes across the seasons by exploring the signs through nature and wildlife. A range of learning activities are used in this unit including observation, discussion and learning outside.
