Where are the Rainforests?	The largest rainforests are in the Amazon River Basin (South America), the Congo River Basin (western Africa), and throughout much of southeast Asia. Smaller rainforests are located in Central America, Madagascar, Australia and nearby islands, India, and other locations in the tropics.
What is the Rainforest Climate like?	A tropical rainforest climate is a tropical climate usually found within 10 to 15 degrees latitude of the equator, and has at least 60 mm (2.4 inches) of rainfall every month of the year. ... A tropical rainforest climate is typically hot, very humid and wet.
What are the layers of the Rainforest?	The tropical rainforest is a complete environment from top to bottom. In general, it is divided into four layers: emergent layer, canopy layer, understory, and the forest floor. These layers host several species of tropical animals and tropical plants.
What is life like in the Rainforest?	Mbuti and Baka Pygmies live in the rainforests of Central Africa. Traditionally they live by hunting and gathering food. The Huli are one of the many tribes that live in the remote highland forests of Papua New Guinea. They live by hunting, gathering plants and growing crops.
What is the Amazon like?	The Amazon rainforest, covering much of northwestern Brazil and extending into Colombia, Peru and other South American countries, is the world's largest tropical rainforest, famed for its biodiversity. It's crisscrossed by thousands of rivers, including the powerful Amazon. River towns.
How can we protect the Rainforest?	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Teach others about the importance of the environment and how they can help save rainforests.</li> <li>2. Restore damaged ecosystems by planting trees on land where forests have been cut down.</li> <li>3. Encourage people to live in a way that doesn't hurt the environment.</li> <li>4. Establish parks to protect rainforests and wildlife.</li> </ol>

Rainforest	a luxuriant, dense forest rich in biodiversity, found typically in tropical areas with consistently heavy rainfall.
