|    | <p><b>What are some of the UK's amazing features and landmarks?</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Landmarks are recognisable and sometimes well-known features of a particular location.</li> <li>The tower of London is located in London (England's capital city)</li> </ul>   |
|    | <p><b>Where are some of the world's most amazing places?</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Asia is the largest continent and Oceania is the smallest.</li> <li>Oceania is the continent the furthest away from the UK</li> </ul>   |
|    | <p><b>Where are our oceans?</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>The world's five oceans are: Pacific Ocean, Atlantic Ocean, Arctic Ocean, Indian Ocean, Southern Ocean.</li> <li>The largest ocean is the Pacific ocean and the smallest id the Artic ocean</li> </ul>   |
|    | <p><b>What is amazing about our local area?</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>We use symbols on a map instead of a detailed drawing so that the map doesn't become too crowded and unclear to read</li> <li>We find out what symbols mean on a map using the key</li> </ul>  |
|   | <p><b>Why are natural habitats special?</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Sampling means having a closer look at a small area to see the types of plants and animals that live there.</li> <li>If the area has more soil/water then it has more plants; or if it is quieter, sheltered and away from paths, then there are more animals.)</li> </ul> |
|  | <p><b>How can we look after natural habitats?</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>It is important to look after natural habitats so animals and plants can survive as habitats provide water, air, food, shelter or space and sunlight</li> </ul>  |
