 What are some of the UK's amazing features and landmarks? Landmarks are recognisable and sometimes well-known features of a particular location. The tower of London is located in London (England's capital city)
 Where are some of the world's most amazing places? Asia is the largest continent and Oceania is the smallest. Oceania is the continent the furthest away from the UK
 Where are our oceans? The world's five oceans are: Pacific Ocean, Atlantic Ocean, Arctic Ocean, Indian Ocean, Southern Ocean. The largest ocean is the Pacific ocean and the smallest id the Artic ocean
 What is amazing about our local area? We use symbols on a map instead of a detailed drawing so that the map doesn't become too crowded and unclear to read We find out what symbols mean on a map using the key
 Why are natural habitats special? Sampling means having a closer look at a small area to see the types of plants and animals that live there. If the area has more soil/water then it has more plants; or if it is quieter, sheltered and away from paths, then there are more animals.)
 How can we look after natural habitats? It is important to look after natural habitats so animals and plants can survive as habitats provide water, air, food, shelter or space and sunlight
