Cause and consequence	NOW! FDGE	<ul> <li>What were the events of the Great Fire of London?</li> <li>The fire began in the bakery and spread quickly destroying 13,200 houses, 87 parish churches, and and St. Paul's Cathedral.</li> </ul>

Monday 3rd September 1666 The fire gets very close to the Tower of London.  Tuesday 4th September 1666 St Paul's Cathedral is destroyed by the fire.  Timeline of Events

Sunday 2nd September 1666 The fire starts at 1 a.m. Mid-morning: Samuel Pepys starts to write about the fire in his diary.  Wednesday 5th September 1666 The wind dies down and the fire spreads more slowly.  Thursday 6th September 1666 The fire is finally put out. Thousands of people are left homeless.
