







# Music Knowledge Organiser Year 2 - Reflect, Rewind & Replay



<p><u>Song for the lesson:</u> <b>Peer Gynt Suite: Anitra's Dance</b></p> <p><u>Key learning:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Classical music is music that has been composed by musicians who are trained in notating their compositions so that other musicians can play them.</li> <li>Orchestral means that it is music performed by an orchestra involving the brass, woodwinds, strings and percussion</li> </ul>	
<p><u>Song for the lesson:</u> <b>Brandenburg Concerto No 1 by Johann Sebastian Bach</b></p> <p><u>Key learning:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>In 1721, Bach presented the Margrave of Brandenburg with manuscripts containing six lively concertos for chamber (small) orchestra. He didn't get paid or thanked!</li> <li>Much of Bach's music was written for the church</li> </ul>	
<p><u>Song for the lesson:</u> <b>From The Diary Of A Fly by Béla Bartók</b></p> <p><u>Key learning:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>The music describes a fly caught in a cobweb, from the fly's point of view as he/she writes in a diary</li> <li>Classical music differs from Pop music because it is not made just to be popular for a short time</li> </ul>	
<p><u>Song for the lesson:</u> <b>Fantasia On Greensleeves by Ralph Vaughan Williams</b></p> <p><u>Key learning:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Ralph Vaughan Williams was an English composer.</li> <li>A folk song is a traditional song, passed on from person to person and is rarely written down, so they get lost or are changed from their original.</li> </ul>	
<p><u>Song for the lesson:</u> <b>Dance Of The Sugar Plum Fairy by Pyotr Ilyich Tchaikovsky</b></p> <p><u>Key learning:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>This piece of music is a dance for a ballerina and part of the Nutcracker ballet</li> <li>You can often hear this music played on adverts during Christmas time.</li> </ul>	
<p><u>Song for the lesson:</u> <b>The Robots (Die Roboter) by Kraftwerk</b></p> <p><u>Key learning:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Kraftwerk is an electronic band from Germany famous for making electronic music in the 70s and 80s.</li> <li>The lyrics tell us about how humans use robots as they wish.</li> </ul>	

## Key Words

Folk tunes/melodies	Music sung or played by people, usually not recorded or performed. Often the music is passed down through families and friends.
Synthesizer	An electric instrument that looks like a keyboard and has pre-recorded and created sounds.
Notation	The link between sound and symbol
Unison	Everyone plays or sings the same music at the same time.
Composing	Creating and developing musical ideas and 'fixing' them.
