	<p>Locational Knowledge - What are some of the UK's amazing features and landmarks?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Landmarks are recognisable and sometimes well-known features of a particular location.
	<p>Locational Knowledge - Where are some of the world's most amazing places?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Asia is the largest continent and Oceania is the smallest
	<p>Locational Knowledge - Where are our oceans?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The world's five oceans are: Pacific Ocean, Atlantic Ocean, Arctic Ocean, Indian Ocean, Southern Ocean.
	<p>Human & Physical Geography - What is amazing about our local area?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> We use symbols on a map instead of a detailed drawing so that the map doesn't become too crowded and unclear to read
	<p>Geographical Skills & Fieldwork - Why are natural habitats special?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Sampling means having a closer look at a small area to see the types of plants and animals that live there. If the area has more soil/water then it has more plants; or if it is quieter, sheltered and away from paths, then there are more animals.)
	<p>Human & Physical Geography - How can we look after natural habitats?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> It is important to look after natural habitats so animals and plants can survive as habitats provide water, air, food, shelter or space and sunlight
