Key Vocabulary

Attributes	A quality or feature regarded as a characteristic or inherent part of someone or something
Cyberbullying	The use of electronic communication to bully a person, typically by sending messages of an intimidating or threatening nature.
Marriage	The legally or formally recognized union of two people as partners in a personal relationship.
Secret	Something that is kept or meant to be kept unknown.
Wedding	A marriage ceremony
