Vipers (reading skills)

The children need to understand what they are reading and be able to empathise with characters within the story. Through Vipers sessions we talk about what they have read and look closely at vocabulary used.

Religious Education

This term we are focussing our learning on two new units:

What does it mean to belong to a faith community?

What makes places sacred to believers?

P.E.

Every day we will have some kind of physical activity so the children will need their PE kit to be here on Monday and they will bring this home on a Friday. They will need a Glenmere sports t-shirt and black shorts, **and an outdoor PE kit, including tracksuit bottoms, a Glenmere hoodie and spare socks. A change of footwear is needed (plimsolls for indoor sessions, trainers for outdoors, and these should not be the same shoes as their school shoes).** This term we will be outdoors for

some of the sessions, so it is VERY important that your child has the correct kit. Please also note that **for ALL PE activities, NO jewellery whatsoever must be worn, including earrings, watches and necklaces.**

Art and DT

In Art we will be looking at Sculpture and 3D – Paper play - We will explore what can be done with paper to create a 3D picture.

Moving story – This unit will focus on moving parts in a picture of a story. We will have a go at making our own moving picture using techniques learnt.

ICT

Children will be practising their typing skills and exploring how to change the font, its size, colour in the first half of term and then creating simple animations in the second half.

Personal Development including PSHE.

In our personal development we will be continuing to look at what makes a good friend and how we can make sure everyone feels safe and happy. We will discuss the British Values and how these are linked to everyday life highlighting the need to be respectful, kind and that everyone has their own opinion about things which is fine and makes our society as diverse as it is. In our PSHE lessons we will be learning about keeping safe and who is there to help with this like the emergency services. We will also continue to have our weekly primary news assemblies which highlights current issues for us to discuss.

More able / Children who require more support

Within the Year 1 classroom and through Glenmere Primary School we provide provision for every child in order for them to reach their full potential. For our more able children they will be given extension activities which enable them to experience deeper understanding.
