<u>P.E.</u>

Every day we will have some kind of physical activity so the children will need their PE kit to be here on Monday and they will bring this home on a Friday. They will need a Glenmere sports t-shirt and black shorts, <u>and an</u> <u>outdoor PE kit, including tracksuit bottoms, a Glenmere hoodie and spare socks. A change of footwear is</u> <u>needed (plimsolls for indoor sessions, trainers for outdoors, and these should not be the same shoes as their</u> <u>school shoes).</u> This term we will be outdoors for some of the sessions, so it is VERY

important that your child has the correct kit. Please also note that **for ALL PE activities, NO** jewellery whatsoever must be worn, including earrings, watches and necklaces.

Art and DT

In Art we will be looking at painting and how we can mix a variety of colours to make new colours or tones. By the end of the term we will all have created a piece of artwork in the style of Clarice Cliff.

In D&T we will be looking at Textiles. We will learn how to join, design and make a puppet.

<u>ICT</u>

Children will be learning all about Robots and how they are programmed to move in the first half term. We will work lots with the Beebots in small groups.

The second half term will focus on data collection.

Personal Development including PSHE.

In our personal development we will be continuing to look at what makes a good friend and how we can make sure everyone feels safe and happy. We will discuss the British Values and how these are linked to everyday life highlighting the need to be respectful, kind and that everyone has their own opinion about things which is fine and makes our society as diverse as it is.

In our PSHE lessons we will be learning about citizenship and Economic wellbeing.

We will also continue to have our weekly primary news assemblies which highlights current issues for us to discuss.

<u>Homework</u>

Homework this term will continue on 'Doodle Learning' It's really important that your child works independently, as the app learns your child's areas of strength and weaknesses so that it can calibrate to the right level for each user. Once the baseline assessment is complete, simply open the app and start answering questions. Any questions, please do not hesitate to ask.

Within the Year 1 classroom and through Glenmere Primary School we provide provision for every child in order for them to reach their full potential. For our more able children they will be given extension activities which enable them to experience deeper understanding.
