
Different brushes make different marks





• Secondary colours are made by mixing two primary colours together



- Different brushes create different effects
- Applying paint thickly can create texture and a balance of colour in my painting



- Different ways of printing can create different patterns and effects
- New colours can be created by overlapping my prints




- Primary colours can be mixed to create light and dark tones
- Adding water or a lighter colour makes a lighter shade
- Adding a darker colour makes a darker shade

- Clarice Cliff used bright rainbow colours with a concentric circle pattern
- Blowing my paint can create a different effect
