Historical Interpretation	How can we tell these toys are old? <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Toys that are old weren't made of plastic like lots of our toys today We can tell there are old by their appearance and what they are made of
Historical Interpretation	What were our grandparents' toys like and how do we know? <ul style="list-style-type: none"> We know about toys from when our grandparents were children from photographs, memories of people themselves, actual objects, museums or pictures/paintings Some toys were similar to ours today but sometimes made with different materials
Similarities and Differences	Who played with these toys a long time ago? <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Toys were played with over a 100 years ago but the toys were different to what we have today Most of them were made out of wood and metal
