



## Key Vocabulary

<b>Charity</b>	An organisation that raises money for those in need.
<b>Community</b>	A group of people in the same area, or have things in common
<b>Council</b>	A group of people who manage a city, county or organisation
<b>Law</b>	Rules enforced by government that define what we can and can't do
<b>United Nations/UN</b>	An international organisation founded in 1945 after World War 2 which aims to maintain international peace and security, human rights and better standards of living
<b>Recycling</b>	Converting waste into reusable materials
<b>Consequence</b>	The result of an action, usually one that is negative or involves punishment

## Key Knowledge

- As children we all have rights. E.g. the right to an education, right to medical care and the right to meet other children and to join groups.
- Being scared or clubs not being available in school can stop us from meeting other children.
- Some countries it is much more difficult to benefit from the rights.
- The rights are part of international law.
- There are 42 rights in total
- Rights include education, play, health, expressing views and to join groups.
- We can help the planet by recycling rubbish.
- Plastic, metal, glass and paper are materials that can be recycled.
- We can recycle at home and at school.
- Building for the community : shops, museums, libraries, community centres, places to eat and religious building.
- There are different groups that exist in a community.
- Adults and children can go to the same building e.g. the school is used by children to learn and adults to work.
- Charities support different things in our community.
- We can support charities by donating or raising money.
- Charities can work locally, across the whole country or in other countries.
- Local councillor decides on how to spend the money in the community.
- Money comes from the people who live in the area and the Government.
- Local council is responsible for: collecting bins, support schools, provide libraries and maintain roads.
