







<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Song for the lesson:</u> <u>Three Little Birds by Bob Marley</u></p> <p><u>Key learning:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The song is by Bob Marley and The Wailers. Robert Nesta "Bob" Marley, (6 February 1945-11 May 1981) was a Jamaican singer-songwriter and musician. He was the rhythm guitarist and lead singer for the reggae band. He has helped spread awareness of Jamaican music around the world. 	
<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Song for the lesson:</u> <u>Jamming by Bob Marley</u></p> <p><u>Key learning:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The Song is sang by Bob Marley and The Wailers. It is a song from their 1977 album Exodus. This song is about jam sessions. Jamming is when a band gets together and improvises around a song or tune they know. 	
<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Song for the lesson:</u> <u>Small People by Ziggy Marley and the Melody Makers with Prairie Dawn and Big Bird.</u></p> <p><u>Key learning:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Davis Nesta 'Ziggy' Marley (born 17 1968 in Trenchtown, Jamaica) is a Jamaican musician and leader of the band Ziggy Marley and The Melody Makers. He is the oldest son of reggae musician Bob Marley. This song appeared on the popular kids television show Sesame Street in the 1991-92 season. The structure includes a bridge. It connects the verse to the chorus of the song. 	
<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Song for the lesson:</u> <u>54-46 That's My Number by Toots & The Maytals</u></p> <p><u>Key learning:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The song was written in 1971 and was one of the first reggae songs to receive widespread popularity outside of Jamaica. The song has been covered many times by different artists. In the chorus there is the hook: 54-45 was my number. The style of song is reggae. 	
<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Song for the lesson:</u> <u>Ram Goat Liver by Pluto Shervington</u></p> <p><u>Key learning:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The song is based on a story of an accident seen by a friend of Pluto. The song has become a folk song. You can hear the instruments: keyboard, drums, bass and electric guitar. There is a guitar solo over the chorus near the end of the song. 	
<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Song for the lesson:</u> <u>Our Day Will Come by Amy Winehouse</u></p> <p><u>Key learning:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The popular song composed by Bob Hilliard and Mort Garson was a number 1 hit in 1963. The original version was a mid-tempo Pop/Latin style. Amy Winehouse covered this song in a Reggae style for her 2011 album. Amy Winehouse was an English singer and songwriter known for her powerful deep vocals. 	

Key Words

Electric guitar	It is a musical string instrument usually played with a pick and sometimes with the fingers.
Hook	A term used to describe a short catchy phrase or riff that we can't stop singing.
Organ	A family of keyboard instruments which is usually played with both hands and feet.
Reggae	Music that deals with social and racial issues and brings in elements of Rastafari.
Cover	A version of a song performed by someone other than the original artist that might sound a bit –or very- different.
