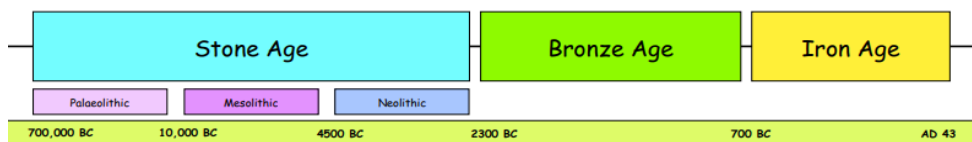
## The Stone Age to the Iron Age (1)



### Knowledge

Cause and consequence	 KNOWLEDGE	<p>Was Stone Age man simply a hunter and gatherer, concerned only with survival?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Britain has only had written history for 2,000 years. Prehistory is split up into Stone, Bronze and Iron ages. The Stone Age is split into 3 periods called the Palaeolithic, Mesolithic and Neolithic.</li> </ul>
Cause and consequence	 KNOWLEDGE	<p>How different was life in the Stone Age when man started to farm?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>There were BIG changes to farming during the Neolithic period in the Stone Age.</li> </ul>
Change and continuity	 KNOWLEDGE	<p>What can we learn about from a study of Skara Brae?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Skara Brae was unearthed because of a storm in 1868. Another storm unearthed more and further excavations happened between 1928 and 1930. It shows a village during the Neolithic period.</li> </ul>
Similarities and differences	 KNOWLEDGE	<p>How have homes changed through the Stone Age?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Use to shelter in caves, then homes were made from wood. Some were made out of stones, shells, animal bones and mud.</li> </ul>
Historical evidence	 KNOWLEDGE	<p>Why is it difficult to work out why Stonehenge was built?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Began 5,000 years ago and Stonehenge is one of the most remarkable achievements of the prehistoric era.</li> </ul>

This timeline shows how prehistory in Britain is split up into 3 main ages.

Prehistory	The period before written history.
Gatherers	A person who collects or forages things.
Tools	Something that is used to make a change to something else or help to do a job.
Shelter	What people and animals use to protect themselves from their surroundings.
Tribal	A group of people having the same ancestors, customs and other characteristics.
Skara Brae	Is a historical sight in the north of Scotland, which show prehistoric villages.
