Historical significance	What does prehistory mean? What are the names of the 3 periods of prehistory?	A period in time before written records. Stone Age, Bronze Age, Iron Age.
Change & continuity	Who were the first people in Britain?	Began as hunter gathers then developed into farmers with the use of more tools.
Change & continuity	How did the hunter gathers survive in the Stone Age?	Their search for food was their main priority. They had to learn which animals and plants to eat. They then learned to become farmers.
Historical significance	Who was the Red Lady of Paviland ?	An ancient human skeleton discovered in 1823 in one of the Paviland limestone caves in South Wales. It is an upper Palaeolithic partial skeleton.
Historical significance	What was Skara Brae?	A famous prehistoric village found on the Orkney Islands.
Sources and evidence	What is a secondary source of information? E.g. historians, archaeologists.	Information from someone who wasn't actually there.
Similarity and differences	How was the Stone age different to the Bronze age?	In the Bronze age farming and tools had advanced. People were living in different hut.
Greater Depth	Explain why it was better once farming began in the Stone Age. Consider and speculate what it would have been like living in the Stone Age and what the hardships would have been compared to modern day life.	


