<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Song for the lesson:</u> <b>Let Your Spirit Fly by Joanna Mangona</b></p> <p><u>Key learning:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Let your Spirit Fly by Joanna Mangona</li> <li>It is an R&amp;B style song written for children.</li> </ul>	
<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Song for the lesson:</u> <b>Let Your Spirit Fly by Joanna Mangona</b></p> <p><u>Key learning:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Pitch is used in the song by voices and instruments.</li> <li>The song is joyous and uplifting, celebrating music and the positive feeling it creates.</li> </ul>	
<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Song for the lesson:</u> <b>The Colonel Bogey March by Kenneth Alford</b></p> <p><u>Key learning:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>It was composed in 1914</li> <li>Malcolm Arnold was a British composer who had many different influences including jazz and classical music</li> </ul>	
<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Song for the lesson:</u> <b>Consider Yourself (From 'Oliver') by Lionel Bart</b></p> <p><u>Key learning:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Oliver! is a British musical, with music and lyrics by Lionel Bart, based upon the novel Oliver Twist by Charles Dickens.</li> <li>Musical beats of 4,3,2 and 1, set in a rhythm grid.  Beats held for 1,2,3 and 4</li> </ul>	
<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Song for the lesson:</u> <b>Ain't No Mountain High Enough by Marvin Gaye</b></p> <p><u>Key learning:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Marvin Gaye (1939–1984) was an African American singer/songwriter/instrumentalist, he was known as 'The Prince of Motown'.</li> <li>This song is soul music with a pop influence.</li> </ul> <p>Musical notes on a staff</p>	
<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Song for the lesson:</u> <b>Thank You for the Music by ABBA</b></p> <p><u>Key learning:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Barry White was known for his bass voice and was one of the world's greatest soul singers.</li> </ul>	

### Key Words

Structure	How the sections of a song are ordered to make the whole piece.
Intro/introduction	Music heard at the beginning of a song or piece of music
Verse	A section in a song which has the same tune but different words
Chorus	A repeated section in a song which gives the main message
Improvise	To make up a tune and play it on the spot.
Tempo.	Describes how fast or slowly the music is played.
