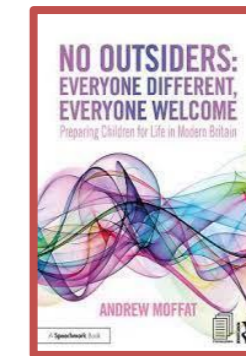


Year 3 Personal Development Curriculum



British Values Key Vocabulary	
British value of democracy	democracy, vote, voting, secret ballot, government, one person one vote, laws, rules, parliament, council, representative, campaign, democratic change, society
British Value of rule of law	law, rules, everyone, rights and responsibilities, police, courts, proper order, safety, wellbeing.
British value of mutual respect and tolerance for diversity	respect, mutual (two way), diversity (gender, disability, faith, belief, ethnicity), care, friendship, everyone has beliefs and some people have religious beliefs.
British Value of individual liberty	choice, own beliefs, freedoms, liberty, individual, each person, protect.

Fundraising: Children in Need, Red nose Day, Jeans for Genes, Christmas Jumper Day (save the children), Harvest Festival.

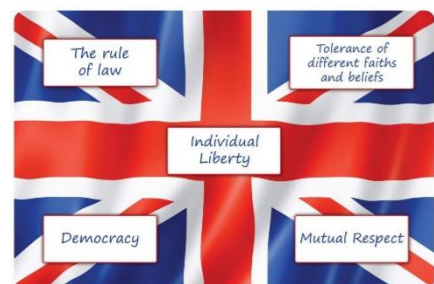
Experiences: Cooking, baking, trips, competitions, visitors, workshops, theatre companies, escape rooms, gardening, life skills
