#### What do Hindu symbols and stories show about belief in Brahman?

- · The sacred symbol of Brahman is known as Om or Aum.,
- Aum is made up of 3 sounds: 'A', 'U', and 'M'.
- · Many Hindus believe that the one true god is Brahman.



### 2. How many gods are there in popular Hinduism?

- · There are many gods and goddesses in Hinduism and each is a way of showing one side of Braham.
- · Lord Brahma symbolises creation.
- · Lord Shiva symbolises destruction



## 3. What does the Trimurti represent?

- Hindus believe that Brahman is comprised of 3 main forms known as the Trimurti.
- The trimurti is made up of the creator, the preserver and the destroyer.
- · Some Hindus believe that a god occasionally appears on earth in a living form.

- Ganesh and Krishna are some of the Hindus Gods.
- · Ganesh is represented with an elephant's head.
- · Ganesh represents the God of beginnings.



## 5. What can we find out about Hindu worship in the home?

- A puja tray is used for worshipping at home.
- · A Mandir is a place of worship for Hindus.
- · A puja tray has many items on it that are used during worship.



#### 6. How does the Diwali story link to a Hindu deity?

- Diwali is known as the 'festival of light', and is a Hindu festival.
- · Diwali is a story about good overcoming evil. Light overcoming darkness.
- · Some Hindus celebrate by dressing in brightly coloured clothes.

- · The word 'Namaste' means 'I bow to you'.
- · Many Hindus believe that all living things contain a part of Brahman.
