

In phonics we have now learnt so many phonemes and diagraphs! The children are working super hard to use their sound knowledge to write words. We practice using our tricky words song each day to remember and write them. The children have tried super hard with their cursive letter formation too!



There have been some marvellous maths moments this term as we have explored deep into the world of numbers 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6 and 7. We have learnt to spot and show these numbers in different ways. We have investigated doubling, halving and sharing of these numbers too. We have begun to look at whether each number we have learnt is odd or even and how we know this. The children have become amazing number explorers in the world around them, showing the different numbers they find each day. The children have enjoyed investigating each of our numbers with the help of the Numberblocks gang.

We have had so many memorable learning moments through exploring traditions and celebrations such as Diwali, Halloween and Remembrance Day.
