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Enrichment at Glenmere

At Glenmere Community Primary School we take part in many enrichment activities. One of these is a Protected Characteristics Day where we move around school with different children from different year groups and go into classes and talk about the different protected characteristics. An example of one of these is marriage and civil partnerships where you shouldn't be discriminated or treated differently because of this.

In addition to this, we have workshops such as the CO crew workshop where we learned about the ricks of Carbon Monoxide and the importance of having a Carbon Monoxide detector. During Diwali – which is celebrated by Hindus and Sikhs – we all took part in a Diya painting workshop where we all decorated our own.

Children in Year 5 and 6 took part in first aid training. The paramedic who came in taught us how to help people who become ill, for example, pass out or have a heart attack. We learned how to put someone in the recovery position and how to carry out CPR. As well as this, children learned how to have bandages wrapped around their wrists or ankles.

We have also had parents in school learning about maths and phonics with their children. We love helping our parents learn. Children across the school have also taken part in lacrosse. Lacrosse is a sport where you have a long stick with a net on the end and a hard ball. The stick is then used to launch the ball.

Earlier in the year, there was the whole school cross country. This is where every boy races a distance then every girl race. It happens once a year and everyone takes part and children are given 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 4th place but it isn't about the winning – it's about the taking part. And an added bonus is the PSA provide us with snacks at the end!

At Glenmere, all year groups get to go on amazing trips.
