English

The first half term we will be writing to inform with instructions. The second half of the term will be writing to entertain where we will be writing a narrative linked to our history; The Great Fire of London in the second half. We will be working hard with our spelling and grammar skills too, to help support our writing, along with a particular focus on handwriting and presentation.

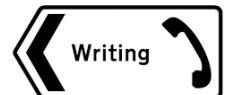

Vipers (reading skills)

It is essential to ensure that the children understand what they are reading and can make opinions about the text and characters.

Remember to log onto the Boom Reader app to record the reading as the children love to score enough points for extra playtime!

- Enjoy stories together - reading stories to your child is equally as important as listening to your child read. They will learn how to use expressive voices and pause at the right places.
- All reading is valuable - it doesn't have to be just stories. Reading can involve anything from fiction and non-fiction, poetry, newspapers, magazines, football programmes, TV guides.

Helpful reading questions to support your child:

- Can you make a prediction? What do you think this book will be about?
- Can you find a page of the story you liked/didn't like? Why?
- What was happening at the beginning of the story?
- Why did (a character) behave in this way?
- Does that sound right?
- Can you change your voice so that it sounds like you are talking?
- How do you think the character said that?
- Now you have decoded all of the words, can you read that sentence to me again?

This term our authors will be Carol Ann Duffy and Jill Thomlinson and we will be using these books in our vipers lessons and as story books for reading for pleasure. Some key year 2 text recommendations from our authors of the half terms

Maths

This term in maths we will be learning about our multiplication and division, the measurement of length and height and money.

The children will also be tackling more problem solving and reasoning activities related to the four operations (addition, subtraction, multiplication and division). Examples of these questions can be seen on the Year 2 class page of our website.

At home you can help your child by:

- Asking them their multiplication facts
- Give the children sums with missing numbers to solve: e.g. $20 - _ = 14$ or $_ + 25 = 39$ or challenging word problems.
- Practice solving word problems with your child. these are always the thing they struggle on the most!

Religious Education

In year 2, we enjoy learning about different religions and beliefs because it helps us to be respectful and good citizens.

For the first half term our big question will be Who is a Muslim and How do they Live? And the second half term our key question will be, What is the good news Christians believe Jesus brings? enables pupils to learn in depth from different

religious and spiritual ways of life. The children will learn about how nature is important across religions and encourage them to make links between religions.

Personal Development including PSHE

In our personal development we will be thinking about what diversity means and understanding that our school is diverse using the book 'The Great Big Book of Families to think about what makes a good friend using the book' and 'Amazing. These sessions promote our teaching of Protected Characteristics. We will be understanding differences and similarities between people in our British Values lessons. In our PSHE lessons we will be learning citizenship in the first half term and economic wellbeing in the second half term. We will also have our weekly Primary News assemblies to keep us up to date with important topics and having discussions about them. We will use Project Evolve alongside our computing and PSHE lessons to teach children about online safety. The two themes for this term will be 'Online Bullying' and 'Managing Online Information'
