During our science lessons we have learned about materials and their properties, investigating if they are waterproof or not.

We have also learned about different scientists and their inventions and discoveries like Alexander Graham Bell and his telephone, Isaac Newton and his discoveries regarding gravity light and they particularly enjoyed learning about the wind using their own wind vanes.

Our topic work has been very informative. In geography the children have developed their knowledge of the UK and can confidently compare it to a village called Kampong Ayer in Brunei. In history we have been learning about famous nurses and have discovered what they did to become significant people in history.
