4. Louis Braille was a French inventor.
5. He was accidentally blinded at the age of 3.

7. Samuel Pepys was a Diarist.
8. He most famously wrote about the events that occurred during the time of the Great Fire of London.
9. Pepys was the first person to inform King Charles II of the fire.
10. Florence Nightingale was a nurse during the Crimean war in the 19<sup>th</sup> Century.
11. She was also known as 'the lady with the lamp.'
