Democracy	A form of government where citizens have a say in how they are ruled including choosing their leaders and deciding on laws.	Tyrant -	The ruler of a Greek city-state, a tyrant was like a king. Today the word tyrant is used to describe a ruler who rules ungairly or unjustly.
