




By the end of this project, I will know the answers to these questions	
What does the term prehistory mean? What are the names of the three periods of prehistory?	A period of time before written records. Stone Age, Bronze Age, Iron Age
Who were the first people in Britain?	Began as hunter gatherers then developed into farmers with the use of more tools.
How did hunter gathers survive in the Stone Age?	Their search for food was their main activity. They had to learn which animals to hunt and which plants to eat. They then, learned to become farmers.
What was cave painting tell us about the Stone Age?	Early humans may have used art as a way of helping themselves in their struggle for survival. They may have been a way to transmit information.
What was Skara Brae?	A fascinating prehistoric village found on the Orkney Islands.
Where did Stone Age people live?	They lived in caves or made shelters from trees, branches and animal skins.
What is a secondary source of information?	Information from someone who wasn't actually there, e.g. archaeologists, historians.
Greater Depth	Explain why it was better once farming began in the Stone Age.
	Consider and speculate what it would have been like living in the Stone Age and what the hardships would have been compared to modern day life.

Stone Age	Earliest period of human culture where stones were first used.	Monument	A group of huge stones often set up in a circle.
Bronze Age	Time period where bronze replaced stone as the preferred materials for making tools and weapons.	Tribe	Iron age people who lived in the same area and did similar things.
Iron Age	Time period where iron became the preferred materials for making tools and weapons.	Neolithic	Youngest part of the stone age, comes from two words in Greek; Neo meaning new and lithic meaning stone. A period where farming was invented and when people began caring for animals such as cows, sheep, pigs.
Artefact	An object made by a human being.	Agriculture	The practice of farming and growing crops. (plants)
Forage	To widely look for nourishment and provisions.	Plantain	A greenish fruit of a kind of banana plant that is eaten cooked and is larger and less sweet than a banana.
Thatched	A thatched house or a house with a thatched roof has a roof made of straw or reeds.	Neanderthal	An early species of human being.
